Statutory Declaration

- This declaration is made under the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959* (the Act) in the knowledge that a person who intentionally makes a false statement in a statutory declaration is guilty of an offence under the Act, the punishment for which is a term of imprisonment for 4 years (see section 11 of the Act) and that Chapter 2 of the Criminal Code applies to all offences under the Act.
- This statutory declaration is also made on the basis of the definition of secretary in section 123 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918 (Electoral Act)
- secretary, in relation to a political party, means the person who holds the office (however described) the duties of which involve responsibility for the carrying out of the administration, and for the conduct of the correspondence, of the party.
